American Heritage Middle and High School Programs 2016–17

Dear Parents and Students,

From the time that we launched our inaugural high school class in the Fall of 2007, we have been actively building a unified K–12 program that offers one of the most powerful and unique elementary and secondary education experiences in the country—one that draws upon Restored Gospel principles to develop both hearts and minds. We have grown carefully over the years, intensely focused on our mission, and open to feedback from all stakeholders, including parents, teachers, students, and board members. We also continue to network with and learn from other outstanding private and public schools. Each year, we make significant improvements as a result of this process, and we are pleased to share with you highlights of what you can expect at American Heritage Middle and High School during the 2016–17 school year.

High School Graduation Requirements. In order to graduate from American Heritage High School, 29 credits will be required according to the attached “High School Graduation Requirements” list, including a Thesis requirement of two credits, 0.50 of which is to be completed during each year of high school. The vast majority of students enrolling in our High School receive 7 to 8 credits per year for their coursework, depending upon their specific class schedule.

Homeroom and Specialized Instruction. All students in grades 7–12 have the benefits of a combined homeroom and specialized instruction model that includes both an integrated homeroom class taught by a single instructor as well as specialized instruction in math, science, fine arts, foreign languages, and electives. Homeroom instructors integrate the subjects of Language Arts, Literature, and History/Geography (in high school, the subjects of Language Arts and Literature are offered as one combined course referred to as “English” for transcript purposes). As in previous years, grades 7–8 also have devotional as a separate 30-minute daily subject taught by their homeroom instructor. Currently, we anticipate course offerings and teacher assignments as set forth on the attached list of “Course Offerings 2016–2017.”

Mathematics. Math continues to be an area of particular focus in 2016–17. We plan to continue our approach of relatively small math classes in our middle and high school math department in a continuing effort to meet students at their various individual levels. Saxon Math will continue to be used through AP Calculus (BC). We also anticipate adding AP Statistics and Accounting as additional electives. Also, many of our math teachers stay after school on a regular basis to accommodate any students that are in need of individual math tutoring.

Science. Over the last seven years, the School has made tremendous progress in increasing student achievement in science, scoring above national norms on standardized science assessments in middle and high school (Explore, PLAN, PSAT, and ACT exams). In 2013, faculty mentors from Brigham Young University's Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy Departments, Dr. John Lamb (Chemistry) and Dr. Michael Ware (Physics and Astronomy) joined our faculty as "visiting fellows" to consult with our science department faculty in an effort to further improve our science teaching and learning. In the past few years American Heritage has implemented various improvements to our science program, including extended lab periods for high school science labs, and room renovations to better accommodate high school labs. The School has also invested in mobile labs which are highly utilized by our Science Department. We continue to add to our science equipment inventory, including Vernier Computer Software and probes, sound resonance equipment, high-power microscopes, and electrophoresis laboratory equipment. We also continue to leverage field-learning, experiential learning, and community project-based opportunities to provide students with instruction and experience outside of the classroom, including continued participation in regional science fairs. As in the past, AP Biology and AP Chemistry will both be available in 2016–17.

On-Campus Curricular Electives. In the 2016–17 school year, we anticipate offering the following curricular electives, primarily for high school students (grades 9–12). These electives will satisfy certain high school graduation requirements, such as fine arts, foreign language, and physical education. Grades 7 and 8 will be included as possible and appropriate. Please note that high school students desiring to take most or all of the above-listed electives AND complete the seminary program may elect to take early-morning seminary one or more years in high school. See more on seminary below.

Advanced Placement Courses. For AHS high school students in 2016–17, we are offering elective AP English Language, AP Calculus (AB & BC), AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Music Theory, and AP Statistics. Students may also register to take other AP exams, for which AP credit may be received by successfully passing an AP exam regardless of whether an AP course, text, or curriculum was actually taken or provided. In connection with American Heritage School's AP program, we will provide subject-specific mentors, college advisement services, information pertaining to AP test dates, in-house AP exam location (all AP exams can be administered at the school), preparation opportunities, and we will also make available to students AP study guides and other preparation materials for library checkout.

Experiential Learning Week. American Heritage School's Experiential Learning Week serves as an intensive implementation of the 4R-ing methodology, with the purpose of bridging academic experiences and exploration of real world applications—all in harmony with American Heritage School's mission statement. Experiential Learning Week, held during the second semester, is a one-week course of study devoted to a single subject selected by the student. In the 2015–16 school year, subjects include Molecular Biology, Art and History of Dance, Photography, Fine Art, Athletics for Life, Digital Media, Web Page Design, Home Economics, World Religions, Constitution Studies, and College and Career Exploration. During Experiential Learning Week, regular classes in grades 9–12 are suspended and replaced with project-based, real-world learning experiences in academic fields of interest to AHS students under the mentorship of qualified AHS instructors, guest presenters, and practitioners. Courses include field learning, laboratory study, and guest presenters. High school students receive a letter grade and .25 credit hours which are required towards graduation for each year of Experiential Learning Week participation.

Seminary. The LDS Church Seminary and Institute Program offers various sections of seminary at American Heritage School, including an early morning section of seminary from 7:10 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. Given AHS's mission of educating students in the light of the Restored Gospel, Seminary is strongly encouraged for all AHS high school students, including those who are not members of the LDS Church; however, seminary is not required for graduation. Students opting not to take seminary should speak with AHS administration.

Extracurricular Programs. We will continue to offer extracurricular basketball, soccer, and cross-country (middle through high school) for both boys and girls, junior-varsity and varsity levels, which will satisfy graduation requirements in physical education. In addition, we are adding girls and boys Volleyball in the fall of 2016, as well as golf and tennis (boys and girls), depending upon interest. Extracurricular drama and musical productions, as well as extracurricular orchestra and choir (beginning, intermediate, and advanced) will continue to be offered conditional upon successful audition. As in the past, certain curricular electives such as Choir, Ballroom Dance, Drama, Constitution Bowl, Orchestra, Science Fair, and other events do require some extracurricular rehearsals and meetings. In 2013 we also added extracurricular National Honors Society in the high school. Students are also welcome to participate in the School Service Association (IUWE), a chess group, after-school yoga classes, and FLL Robotics that is open to students from elementary through 8th Grade.

Student Government. Student Government operates with class officers in grades 7 through 12. Student Government officers in high school receive credit for participating in the program, and operate with their own budget. Student Government officers will continue to have direct access to administration through weekly Student Government meetings that include Mr. Dye, Miss Jacob, Mr. Hunsaker, and other AHS administrators. In addition, the President of the Student Government Association and the Speaker for Middle School meet monthly for lunch with Mr. Beckwith.

Calendar and Daily Schedule. The daily schedule will remain unchanged for grades 7 through 12. The school day begins at 8:10 a.m. and ends at 3:10 p.m., not including early morning seminary and extracurricular programs. By way of comparison, the total in-class hours for middle and high school equal the total in-class hours of the Alpine School District middle and high school calendars, even though the number of school days at AHS continues to be less (18 days less: we start the school year later in August, end sooner in May, and take a full week's break at Thanksgiving and Easter). We equal the in-class hours of the Alpine School District through avoiding a number of part-day schedules that are commonly used in the public system.

For those families that have elementary school students, the daily schedule for grades K–6 will also remain unchanged (classes begin at 8:30 a.m. and conclude the day at 3:05 p.m.). As is currently the practice in most classrooms, beginning at 8:15 a.m., teachers in grades K–6 will provide supplemental enrichment activities for students who arrive early and are awaiting the 8:30 a.m. bell. As always, if families have special circumstances pertaining to arrival or dismissal, we will be as flexible as possible to accommodate those schedules.

Technology Initiative. Recognizing the vital role of technology in education, we will continue to provide the option for high school students (grades 9 through 12) to use personal laptops at school for note taking, research, and writing purposes related to school curriculum. Effective the 2016–17 school year, we are expanding that initiative to include middle school (grades 7–8) on a limited basis at the discretion of the

teacher for specific assignments that may be facilitated by the school's mobile computer lab and personal laptops.

Accreditation. American Heritage School is accredited through AdvancED (same accreditation association that accredits the public school regionally) and is listed on the Utah State Office of Education's register of accredited Utah schools. American Heritage School is also a fully accredited member of the Northwest Association of Independent Schools (NWAIS). For information related to AdvancED and NWAIS, please see their websites listed below. As important as accreditation is, please note that most college admissions offices are far less concerned about accreditation than they are about the capability of the individual student, as measured by the student's academic performance, the array of classes taken, and, most importantly for most colleges, the standardized test scores of the student.

Standardized Testing. American Heritage School prepares students to succeed on standardized exams while at the same time avoiding an over-fixation with high-stakes exams that has in many other schools compromised true education, inspired curriculum, and mission-centered culture. We also provide free extracurricular exam preparation seminars (held on most K-12 Inservice Fridays) that help students to prepare for ACT and SAT exams. We administer selections of ACT and SAT preparation exams to our students in grades 10–12. We administer standardized tests as necessary and appropriate to provide parents, teachers, and college admissions offices with the benefit of comparable and credible performance data for each of our students. Based upon our research, and consistent with the trends of various other private schools in Utah, we will continue to administer the PSAT/NMSQT to 10th and 11th Grade students, the ACT PLAN exam to 9th Grade students, the ACT EXPLORE and STAR exams to 8th Grade students, and the STAR exam to 7th grade students. The ACT EXPLORE, ACT PLAN and PSAT/NMSQT exams have value not only as norm-referenced national standardized exams, but also as preparatory exams for the ACT and SAT, which are accepted by all universities in the nation. In elementary school, we administer STAR Reading, STAR Math, and STAR Early Literacy with a limited sequence and frequency sufficient to aid teachers and parents in assessing progress. Home & Distance Education. American Heritage Home and Distance Education courses are available to students enrolled on campus, and provide significant flexibility and additional elective options for students with varying interests. College Preparation and Admission. Our high school program is producing outstanding students that are being sought after by some of the finest colleges in the country. The five graduating senior classes since 2011, comprising 132 students, have a graduation rate of well over 95%, with average ACT scores exceeding 25, including multiple National Merit qualifiers and recipients. Administration conducts interviews with each high school student (and their parents when possible) at least once each year.

American Heritage is a school with a providential mission to “educate hearts and minds for latter-day families.” We appreciate the support and enthusiasm of so many in our school community who have provided (and continue to provide) input, ideas, people, and resources to help make this endeavor an overwhelming success, and to further bless the lives of the rising generation!
