American Heritage Middle and High School Programs, 2013-2014

Dear Parents and Students,

From the time that we launched our inaugural high school class in the Fall of 2007, we have been actively building a unified K-12 program that offers one of the most powerful and unique elementary and secondary education experiences in the country – one that draws upon Restored Gospel principles to develop both hearts and minds. We have grown carefully over the years, intensely focused on our mission, and open to feedback from all stakeholders, including parents, teachers, students, and board members. We also continue to network with and learn from other outstanding private and public schools. Each year, we make significant improvements as a result of this process, and we are pleased to share with you highlights of what you can expect at American Heritage Middle and High School during the 2013-2014 school year.

High School Graduation Requirements. In order to graduate from American Heritage High School, 28 credits will be required according to the attached “High School Graduation Requirements” list, including a Thesis requirement of two credits, 0.50 of which is to be completed during each year of high school. The vast majority of students enrolling in our High School receive 7 to 8 credits per year for their coursework, depending upon their specific class schedule.

Core and Specialized Instruction. All students in grades 7-12 have the benefits of a combined core and specialized instruction model that includes both an integrated core class taught by a single instructor as well as specialized instruction in math, science, art, foreign languages, and electives. Core instructors integrate the subjects of Language Arts, Literature, and History/Geography (in high school, the subjects of Language Arts and Literature are offered as one combined course referred to as “English” for transcript purposes). As in previous years, grades 7-8 also have devotional as a separate 30-minute daily subject taught by their core instructor. Currently, we anticipate course offerings and teacher assignments as set forth on the attached list of “Course Offerings 2013-2014.”

Mathematics. Math continues to be an area of particular focus in 2013-2014. We plan to continue our approach of relatively small math classes in our middle and high school math department in a continuing effort to meet students at their various individual levels. Saxon Math will continue to be used through AP Calculus (BC). Also, we will continue our volunteer after-school math lab, and will expand the lab to the extent that we feel it is being regularly used by students and families.

Science. Over the last five years, the School has made tremendous progress in increasing student achievement in science, scoring significantly above national norms on standardized science assessments in middle and high school (Explore, PLAN, PSAT, and ACT exams). In 2012 we implemented various

improvements to our science program, including an additional faculty member (chemistry and middle school science instruction); more chemistry, physics, and biology lab equipment (including Planck's Constant Determinant Apparatus, sound resonance equipment, additional high-power microscopes, electrophoresis laboratory equipment, a spectrometer, and access to virtual labs such as KET Virtual AP Physics Lab); and continued participation in high school regional science fairs. The Teacher Development and Curriculum Committee continues to actively review new science texts for school's various science classes. We also continue to leverage optional science projects and field-learning opportunities to provide students with instruction and experience outside of the classroom. AP Biology, AP Physics, and AP Chemistry will all be available in 2013-2014.

On-Campus Curricular Electives. In the 2013-2014 school year, we anticipate offering the following curricular electives, primarily for high school students (grades 9-12). These electives will satisfy certain high school graduation requirements, such as fine arts, foreign language, and physical education. Grades 7 and 8 will be included as possible and appropriate. Please note that high school students desiring to take most or all of the above-listed electives AND complete the seminary program may elect to take early-morning seminary one or more years in high school. See more on seminary below.

Advanced Placement Courses. Advancement Placement (AP) courses are generally offered by public schools beginning in 11th Grade. For AHS high school students in 2013-2014, we are offering elective AP English Literature and Composition, AP Calculus (AB & BC), AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Music Theory, AP Physics, and AP Spanish. Students may also register to take other AP exams, for which AP credit may be received by successfully passing an AP exam regardless of whether an AP course, text, or curriculum was actually taken or provided. In connection with American Heritage School's AP program, we will provide subject-specific mentors, college advisement services, information pertaining to AP test dates, in-house AP exam location (all AP exams can be administered at the school), preparation opportunities, and we will also make available to students AP study guides and other preparation materials for library checkout.

Seminary. CES will be providing various sections of seminary at American Heritage School in 2013-2014, including an early morning section of seminary from 7:10 a.m. to 8:00 a.m., depending on the number of enrolled students.

Extracurricular Programs. We will continue to offer extracurricular basketball, soccer, and cross-country (middle through high school) for both boys and girls, JV and Varsity, which will satisfy graduation requirements in physical education. Extracurricular drama and musical productions (high school only), as well as extracurricular orchestra and choir (beginning, intermediate, and advanced) will continue to be offered conditional upon successful audition. As in the past, certain curricular electives such as Choir, Ballroom Dance, Drama, Constitution Bowl, Orchestra, Science Fair, and other events do require some extracurricular rehearsals and meetings. We also will be adding extracurricular National Honors Society in the middle and high school beginning this coming Fall 2013.

Student Government. Student Government will continue to operate with class officers in grades 7 through 12. Beginning in the Fall of 2013, elected Student Government officers in high school will receive credit for participating in the program, will have a budget from proceeds of Spirit Apparel sales, and will continue to have direct access to administration through attending weekly Student Government meetings that include Mr. Dye, Miss Jacob, Mr. Anderson, and other AHS administrators.

Calendar and Daily Schedule. The daily schedule will remain unchanged for grades 7 through 12. The school day will begin at 8:10 a.m. and end at 3:10 p.m., not including early morning seminary, and extracurricular programs. By way of comparison, the total in-class hours for middle and high school continue to exceed the total in-class hours of the Alpine School District middle and high school calendars, even though the number of school days at AHS continues to be less.

For those families that have elementary school students as well, the daily schedule for grades K-6 will also remain unchanged (classes begin at 8:30 a.m. and conclude the day at 3:05 p.m.). As is currently

the practice in most classrooms, beginning at 8:15 a.m., teachers in grades K-6 will provide supplemental enrichment activities for students who arrive early and are awaiting the 8:30 a.m. bell. As always, if families have special circumstances pertaining to arrival or dismissal, we will be as flexible as possible to accommodate those schedules.

Technology Initiative. Recognizing the vital role of technology in education, we will continue to provide the option for high school students (grades 9 through 12) to use personal laptops at school for note taking, research, and writing purposes related to school curriculum. Any non-approved use of a personal laptop computer at school (including but not limited to video games, e-mail, or text messaging) will result in the temporary or permanent loss of laptop privileges for the student at school. If you choose to purchase a laptop, we recommend that you purchase one that will meet the suggested minimum requirements set forth below:

Minimum Hardware Requirements:

- 1GB RAM
- DVD player, CD-RW burner
- Wireless network capabilities

Minimum Software Requirements:

- M.S. Office
- Windows 7 (or more current)
- Anti-Virus protection

A PC operating system is recommended for compatibility and on-site trouble-shooting purposes; however, to our current knowledge, most programs that we will be using are Macintosh compatible or have special Macintosh versions of their software.

Accreditation. American Heritage School is accredited through Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC) with provisional status and is listed among the Utah State Office of Education Accredited Schools. American Heritage School is also pursuing accreditation with the Pacific Northwest Association of Independent Schools (PNAIS), from whom American Heritage School has received Candidate Member status. By the conclusion of the 2012/2013 school year, we expect (but cannot guarantee) dual accreditation by both PNAIS and NWAC. Congratulations to everyone involved in our accreditation efforts! It has been a tremendous amount of work that benefits our students in many ways.

Please note that most college admissions offices are far less concerned about accreditation than they are about the capability of the individual student, as measured by the student's academic performance, the array of classes taken, and, most importantly for most colleges, the standardized test scores of the student.

Standardized Testing. This year we administered selections of ACT preparation exams and practice ACT exams to our students in grades 10-12. We will continue to administer standardized tests as necessary and appropriate to provide parents, teachers, and college admissions offices with the benefit of comparable and credible performance data for each of our students. Based upon our research, and consistent with the trends of various other private schools in Utah, we will continue to administer the PSAT NMSQT to 10th and 11th Grade students, the ACT PLAN exam to 9th Grade students, and the ACT

EXPLORE exam to 8th Grade students. Both the ACT EXPLORE and ACT PLAN have value not only as norm-referenced national standardized exams, but also as preparatory exams for the ACT and SAT, which are accepted by all universities in the nation.

Home & Distance Education. American Heritage Home and Distance Education courses are available to students enrolled on campus, and provide significant flexibility and additional elective options for students with varying interests. Administration conducts interviews with each high school student (and their parents when possible) at least once each year.
