

Edline Information

American Heritage School uses a web-based parent communication tool called Edline that facilitates more timely access to grades, homework assignments, classroom calendars and other information. To access your family Edline account, go to the "For Parents" section of the school's website (www.american-heritage.org) and click on "Parent Information Link".

Please note the following:

- The email address you provided on your enrollment application is the one that administration and teachers will use to contact you with classroom-specific information, as well for important school-wide announcements, and emergencies (if any). You can update the e-mail address on your Edline account at any time by logging in and clicking **Account, Manage Account**.
- If you have multiple students attending the school, you should see all of their names included in your family Edline account. If any of your students are missing, please contact us. Note that you must separately select each student to access his or her individual classroom information.
- Please be aware that as with other communication tools (including e-mail, telephone, website postings, and letters, etc.) teachers can choose the method that fits their classroom and personality best. Many teachers use Edline for the obvious benefits that it affords; however, teachers are not required to use it. If a teacher chooses not to use Edline, he/she is still required to communicate regularly with parents, and is still required to make regular progress reports available to parents and students via another method. Regular communication is one of the most important aspects of teacher evaluations. Administration uses Edline for school-wide communication and calendaring.
- Edline, as with all technology, can be a blessing or a curse depending upon how it is used or abused. Parents should be careful not to over-use this tool by placing undue pressure on teachers to post assignment/scores or by placing constant or undue pressure on children regarding scores and grades.
